On March 5, 1946, Winston Churchill, accompanied by United States President Harry Truman, visited Westminster College in Fulton, Missouri to deliver the college's annual John Findley Green Foundation Lecture. Churchill's speech, "The Sinews of Peace" (commonly known as the "Iron Curtain Speech") extolled the virtues of Anglo-American democracy and warned of the looming threat of Russian communist expansion in Europe. Widely recognized as a starting point of the Cold War, the speech provided a blueprint for how the West would wage, and arguably win, the Cold War.
